From the Pastor's Pen:

HOW FAITHFUL ARE YOU?

I am intrigued by many church newsletters and what is happening in the lives of the churches. There appears to be many churches like ours that need renewal. Look at some of this material that appears to be happening in many of our churches and recognize that there is relevance for all of us.

We have read and heard about “employee discount pricing for everyone” and that marketing strategy many times gets our attention. Well if it does get our attention, I want us to give attention to a most important matter. I want to talk to you about Church Attendance. There is not anything to buy at a discount price or to be given away, but to see the importance of being in God’s House every Sunday. It alarms me that we have such a casual attitude towards Bible study, worship attendance, tithing and outreach.

For those of you that are always faithful in attendance, study and worship, you can skip the rest of the article and turn this page over and read the other events for the upcoming month. This article is for those who, for some reason and at some point along the way, lost your dedication to the Lord and His Church. There are many reasons people become unresponsive, apathetic and inactive in the Kingdom’s work, but there are no good reasons—only excuses.

Some have stopped coming because of sin. Big time sin. They are living immoral lives that are not pleasing to God and they feel guilty and coming to church reminds them of those bad choices. If you are reading this and fit into this category, the good news is that God loves you and it is not too late to change your life.

Another reason some people stop attending church is because they think they get a better offer. Racing, ballgames, golf, fishing, recreation and shopping take place over worship, Bible study and spiritual growth. Take time out to enjoy life, but leave Sunday for rest and renewal.

Some people stop attending church because of anger or hurt. A careless word by a fellow believer or misunderstanding may affect some individuals sense of need and they come only on a casual basis or stop completely. There are hurts such as personal loss, health or other items that affect some people’s lack of attendance. Many ministers say that of all reasons cited by parishioners for nonattendance, this is the most cited area. If this is your reason, give me a call and let’s talk about these issues.

With casual attendance comes a lack of commitment and giving of oneself and an opportunity to grow and mature the way God intended for you to grow.

There are lots of reasons stated for lack of attendance but I think you see a picture evolving. I am very aware that some are sick, home bound, serve as care-givers or have to work on Sundays. God knows about these and God cares, but there are many of us who need to make a new commitment to get involved again.

SENDING GOOD NEWS AND GREAT JOY

Discover how Operation Christmas child shoebox gifts lead to evangelism, discipleship, and multiplication of believers and churches.

EVANGELISM

In addition to receiving their shoebox gift, children also receive The Greatest Gift, a storybook that shares the message of salvation. The booklet shares 11 Scripture stories and invites children to follow Christ. Children take this home to share with family and friends. It is used in more than 80 languages.

After the boys and girls hear the Good News, they receive a surprise that may be their first gift ever. They get to hold in their hands a tangible expression of God's love, a shoebox filled with gifts just for them.

DISCIPLESHIP

After receiving shoebox gifts, many children are invited back to participate in a discipleship program, The Greatest Journey. Through this 12 lesson course of Bible stories and memorizing Scripture, the children learn how to follow Christ in their daily lives. More than 14.9 million children have enrolled in this course since 2009.

MULTIPLICATION

Since 2009, more than 6.9 million children have reported decisions for Christ while taking these courses. Not only children but their families and communities have received the message of salvation. After completing the Greatest Journey children attend a graduation celebration and receive a certificate. Most importantly they receive a copy of the New Testament. For many this is the only Bible they have ever had or their family.

PRAYER

The most important part of the journey of a shoebox is **prayer**. As we **pray** over the shoeboxes we pack, **pray** for the boy or girl who will receive them. **Pray** for the teachers who will share the Good News and those who will disciple them. The key word for the ministry of Operation Christmas Child is **PRAYER**.
