### How Samaritan Purse "shoebox" ministry made impact on Russian girl now living here

Born three years after the 1986 Chernobyl disaster in Russia with a spinal defect Natasha Ivanova recalls her journey from Russia to Burlington as one in "black and white" without color. It would be a simple shoebox ministry from the U.S. that would transform her life.

She was born in Belarus to a very loving family. Natasha's' parents worked hard while her grandmother took care of her and her brothers. Because of her disability and new government regulations at that time she could not attend school. There was no money for her to attend a special school so she was sent to an orphanage. She was forced to leave her family at the age of 8 years old. She felt so alone and just wanted to be with her family.

During her second year at the orphanage, the children were told to skip their afternoon nap and come back to the classroom. We didn't know why, but little did we know we would be receiving a "present". Natasha did not know what a present was. When she saw the boxes wrapped in bright Christmas paper she realized there was color in the world. When Natasha opened her box and saw a box of crayons, she couldn't believe someone cared enough to pack this box for her.

At the bottom of the box was a pamphlet in English and since Natasha couldn't read English she took it to one of her teachers. The teacher told her to throw it away but she put it back in my box.

Sometime after receiving her box she received news she was going to the United States for treatment from the physical affects of radiation. While staying with a family in Graham and Mebane she learned to speak English. When returning home she remembered the pamphlet in her shoebox. When she got it out and read it she knew what was missing in her life, Jesus Christ.

Fourteen years later Natasha has made a permanent residence in Burlington and attends Liberty University to receive her Master's degree.
