OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

The following is an email that explains why we haven't heard where our shoeboxes have been sent.

Our shoeboxes are still awaiting a confirmation on the final destination. Some of these boxes will be going to children in Caribbean countries where shoeboxes have never been sent before. Others will be sent to what we call a "hard-to -reach" country, which is a place where the Gospel message is restricted. Still others are being set aside for distribution at upcoming special events. We will continue to check the website over the next few weeks to see where our boxes are sent.

Millions of shoebox gifts have been collected in 2017 to be distributed to children in countries around the world. While we would love to deliver all of them as close to Christmas as possible, factors beyond our control such as the customs procedures of the receiving countries sometimes result in delays. Also, some countries may not celebrate Christmas as we do, so boxes may be distributed to the children at alternate times.
