rom the Pastor's Pen: The Sunday School is a wonderful placer to connect with Jesus Christ, fellow believers and make new friends, as well as to grow spiritually. The "Great Commission" is found in Matthew 28:19-20. When asked what the verb is in the Great Commission most people say it is "go". The truth, however is God wasn't trying to tell us to go anywhere. People are always on the go. If you have children you know how much they are on the go. Roller blades instead of shoes seem rather natural to them. Teenagers are on the go, too. They go out. They go steady. They go to the movies. They are always on the go to somewhere. Adults aren't any different! Adults stay on the go. In fact, the average American family will move every 3 years. God wasn't telling us to go. He knew we already do plenty of going. The verb in the Great Commission is "make". The phrase, "Go, therefore into all the world" is a participle. The better translation is, "...as you are going into all the world." As we are going, we are to be making disciples The primary purpose of the church is to make disciples as we are going into all the world. Sunday School is the primary tool we have available to us to help introduce people to this discipleship journey. One of the greater purposes of Sunday School is to create an environment whereby the unsaved can be evangelized and be encouraged to begin a life of faithful discipleship. If you are not in Sunday School, you are missing out! Sunday school really is the "entry level" of our church. In Sunday School you can meet others who are searching, just like you. You can develop friendships and a fellowship with others by studying the Bible, sharing your dreams and being an essential part of the community that is on the go. Sunday School is about changing lives, changing a community, one soul at a time. A Harvard preaching professor tells a story about himself and his five year old son. In his son's preschool, the children were working on plaster of paris gifts. His son worked from October 31 to December 20 on a plaster butterfly. After the preschool Christmas performance the little boy retrieved his labor of love and ran to give it to Dad. Something happened; he tripped and fell. The brightly colored butterfly went sailing across the room and broke into pieces. Attempting to console his child, the father said "Oh, Son, don't worry. It's nothing." That didn't help! The mother, however, quickly said, "Oh, yes it is something!" She began to pick up the pieces. That night, mother, father and son laboriously glued it all back together. Today, that labor of love, glued together with cement and love, sits proudly on Dad's desk. Broken lives and shattered dreams are something! They are something to Jesus. Jesus helps us to put life back together again. Sunday School is where God has a community that can help with the love and the glue. It will do you good and God will bless you.
